He has handled cases, both nationally and internationally, with the American Horse Shows Association, FEI and the Court of Arbitration for Sport.

He is currently director of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board Equine Drug Testing and Research program at Cornell University and associate professor of Toxicology at Cornell.
